What an amazing year this has been. Thank you to the committed, hardworking team of the Bollington Photographic Group.

Simon Nottage has been spearheading the development of our website bpg22.org. There is still an amazing amount of work to do but it is now allowing important things to happen.

It provides a snapshot of our varied activities and quality of work along with access to booking, viewing and voting in our photo wall contest. Membership enrolment, renewal, information about photo walks and open meetings, and booking of places on our events are now easy. It gives us direct links from our Facebook presence. QR coded leaflets direct people to our website. This has been instrumental in increasing our membership substantially over this year.

Initial work in the New Year will be to improve and build individual gallery pages for our members, linked to the group image upload pages. Simon needs our support to make this happen. We need to upload our best images of photo walks, personal passions, events, community involvement etc. so that visitors to the site can see our work. enabling our work to be accessed for the benefit of local groups etc.

And we hope to have the content of our amazing Open Meeting talks uploaded onto our Knowledge Hub soon.

Andrew Huggett has been multitasking all year. Spending hours helping Simon with the website, providing expert advice on the photo walks which he organised efficiently and reliably, Updating the group's Facebook page with details of our events. He researches everything he undertakes with great attention to detail. He has improved the photo techniques of a lot of the people who have attended our photo walks with his clear instructions. Meeting 1

Matters Arising:-

Authorisation of Simon Nottage as an authorised person to do business banking on behalf of Bollington Photographic Group?

It has been agreed by Bollington Photographic Group that Simon Nottage will be authorised, in addition to the Groups Treasurer i.e. Terry Heathcote, to undertake business banking associated with the Group's NatWest business bank account.

This was a unanimous decision.

Finances:-

• We have £489.72p in our account.

The membership subscriptions were discussed. We decided:-

- → to raise the annual subscription to £28 from £25.
- → the quarterly membership will cost £8.50
- there would be a free trial web membership for new subscribers for one month.

Membership:-

There has been our first trial member signed up. Dronergram. He has added two photos to the Winter Competition.

Web Site:-

It has now gone live!

John Howarth voiced the feeling of all on the committee when he said how much we owe to Simon and Andrew. The web site has involved a huge amount of talent, dedication, time, stubbornness, determination and persistence. And now it is up and running! Thank you so much.

Simon has asked for our continued appraisal of the web site and how it is working. He mentioned the navigation. Is this working or does it need improvement? Is it working over multi gadgets? Are there any other problems?

Several questions were asked and Simon showed us how to sort them.

Obviously there will always be issues to resolve but the hard work has been done.

The old website, Bollington Photo Group, has now been taken down. The payment for the url will continue for 2 years at a cost of £50. This will help towards a transition towards the new site, bpg22.org. After these two years this will be discontinued.

Now we need continuous new content. Simon outlined a challenge that would do this. See in A.O.B.

The Turners Photo Wall:-

There has been some confusion between this and the Winter Photo Competition. We have learned some lessons about making decisions without the backing of the committee. This will help in the future.

We will merge the two competitions and continue as we have always been doing for the Turners Photo Wall. So the time scale for the next exhibition is as follows:-

2nd January to 19th January - Announce the submission for new exhibition on the website.

20th January to 27th January - Open up for voting. Advertise this on the web site and on Facebook.

Simon and John together will confirm the winners.

31st January - New wall goes up.

The submission window has now closed so we are open for voting. As paid up members we can vote for as many images as we want.

And there is a reminder that these photos should be taken in Bollington or very nearby.

Perhaps the overall winner could have the photo posted as the Hero image.

I think these issues to be discussed more thoroughly at our net committee meeting.



There needs to be some clarification about the "rules" or alternatively "terms of entry."

Submission of images

- · We decided that it should be called an "Exhibition." (Not a competition or a contest.)
- · Only paid up members of the BPG can enter images.
- Only 3 images can be submitted by each member.
- The photos should have been taken in Bollington or its surrounds.
- There is space on the wall for 12 images. The images with the most votes will be used. If, however, there is a tie in the voting, an executive decision will be made by John to choose the final twelve. (At this stage the images would be anonymous.)

Voting for images

- · The choice of images will be decided by voting.
- Facebook involvement is to be encouraged for the voting stage. A link to the website will be posted on our group's page. BPG members can vote too.
- · No voting for your own image.
- Only one vote for each image you like but how many votes you use is up to you.

The exhibition of images

- Each photo printed will have the name of the photographer on it.
- The photos belong to the photographer. They are for sale. The photographer should be contacted for a price if someone wants to purchase them.
- Images could be printed for sale at a cost (currently of £5) or offered as a jpeg.
- 10% of the profits of sale go to the Group.

The best walks seem to be when we engineer some learning as we go.


The "Signs of Spring" theme has generated 5 photo walks.

Bollington Festival

Meeting with Rebecca Roth-Biester 17.3.23.

These are Rebecca's notes:-

Key Points

- Website: bpg22.org
- Founded in 2007 in the run-up to 2009 Festival. Originally called "Bollington Festival Photography Group"
- BPG is extremely keen to be involved in 2026 Festival and potentially 2024 Jubilee Jamboree
- Important BPG members are known to Festival Committee (and stewards) and easily identifiable at events to avoid any misunderstandings in terms of event admission
- New member of BPG, "Richard" is a professional drone operator Chris Bennett has his contact details
- At a previous Festival a webcam was set up in a window overlooking the Festival marquee taking shots every seven minutes - the footage is in BPG archive
- No photos were permitted at the last Festival's "Bollington Best" event featuring lots of school children - might be worth considering an "opt-out" option in future, so there is an assumption photos are taken unless participants actively request they are not photographed
- BPG has plenty of images of Festivals since 2007 but it would be terrific to launch a campaign to encourage folk to share any pre-2007 photos - particularly as we will be celebrating 60yrs of the Festival
- There are also plenty of old Festival videos around
- Andrew would love to gather vintage Kodachrome slides of the Festival as well he can scan them at very good resolution

ACTION

- Rebecca to meet with Simon Nottage founder of BPG, now retired, created BPG website and has lots of ideas
- Rebecca to act as Festival contact point for BPG members
- Longer term, a member(s) of BPG to attend a future Bollington Festival meeting, to put faces to names and share ideas.

Janet's notes from the meeting

- We hope to be recognised as part of the Festival team, rather than "outsiders."
- · Perhaps we could be recognised as such with official Festival lanyards like all the other volunteers.
- We would like to be invited to the Volunteers meeting before the Festival.
- · We know how to be low key at Festivals.
- · The next full Festival will be in 2026.
- Rebecca mentioned that it will be the 60th anniversary of the Festival and they were wondering about archive images from past Festivals. We wondered if this would be a good opportunity to persuade people

- to look through their family archive of photos fro the 60's onwards that are still on Kodachrome slides. We could digitise them.
- We stressed how interested we are to liaise with the Festival via websites. And explained that Simon is very keen to contact the Festival Committee's web person. Contact Matt Butcher.



Finances

- We have £835 in the bank.
- In an alteration to last month's minutes, Jackie Timms has now paid the full amount for the photos printed for the last exhibition.
- The grant of £200 from the Beer Festival has not been paid to us yet. This was granted to us to help with costs of the website.
- Terry has applied for a grant of £100 from the Bollington Town Council. This is his application.

"To publicise Bollington Photographic Group further around Bollington and to encourage new members the Group have decided to have posters and flyers printed advertising the Group's activities, for distribution around the Town. In addition, the Group's aim is to exhibit members framed photographs in various locations around Bollington. Monies will be required not only for the printing of the posters and flyers but also for frames and branded mounts for our exhibited photographs'."

So far the cost of the posters is £10 and flyers is £30

I asked members to add items to discuss at this meeting.

Lisa Cox replied:-

"I am enjoying being a member, and have enjoyed both photo walks I went on, and also the competition!

My only suggestion for improvement would be the website- it's not very easy to navigate, and also I couldn't find it all using search engines like google ie I think you can only access it if you have been sent a link."

Simon agreed that this is correct. We have not allowed any search engines to index our site yet due to security concerns. When the transfer to our new host is complete, we will enable search engine access.

Maybe to access the website you could bookmark the link www.<u>bpg22.org</u>, Or a quicker way is to bookmark the link <u>www.bpg22.org/login</u>.

Andrew Huggett asked for Website hosting to be discussed.

He and Simon explained that, at the moment, we have a contract for hosting with IONOS. This costs £9.60 per month. And we pay £19.20 per year for the domain name. This contract ends in November and is automatically renewed – although we can choose to terminate the contact at anytime after this with no financial penalty. Transferring the existing domain name to the new provider will incur a one-off cost of £12.49. Then moving forward would cost a similar amount of £19.20 per year.

After much research it is proposed that we change to an alternative host called 20i. They are British, based in the Midlands and for £11.99 per month (plus VAT) instead of £9.60 they would give us the staging and duplication options we need. This would greatly simplify the work on the website.

They would also let us deal directly with money transactions. instead of getting Andrew to pay and then having him reimbursed by us.

We voted on this proposal and it was confirmed unanimously that we don't renew our contract with IONOS and go with the new provider 20i.

A website job for us:-

Simon asked for us to identify what needs adding or deleting from the front end of the website and let him know.

He also wants to develop the knowledge hub and make it pertinent to our group. We would need the members to help with this by contributing appropriate local photos for illustration.



Previously we had a contract for hosting with IONOS. This costs £9.60 per month with £19.20 per year for the domain name. Ending in November the contract was automatically renewed – although we could choose to terminate at anytime after this with no financial penalty. Transferring the existing domain name to the new provider would incur a one-off cost.

However Simon has found problems with IONOS and has been working hard to find better hosting for the website. He has now found Hosting. It will give us faster speeds and allow backing up. And the price is better too.

At the moment Simon is also working to rebuild the two sites (real and trial) side by side.

Turners Photo Wall

John Howarth explained that he deals with the printing of the images. All the costs of this are reimbursed by the group.

We are in the process of relocating the display to a better place in the Turners. The "Overlooked Bollington" exhibition will be the last in the old location. It is probably that there will not be room for 12 images in the future. We might only be able to display 9 but these will be in frames, examples of which John brought to the meeting. There will also be a permanent BPG banner to advertise who is responsible for the images.
