



















May - Arts Trail








Thursday, 14th March






Canal walk to Whiteley Green

14 November 2024 Outside The Scout Hall

A wander around the fields at Lowerhouse to photograph some autumn colour. Let's aim to shoot some fallen leaves from a lower angle using pathways as leading lines towards trees in the background. Consider bringing a wide-angle lens if you have one as well as bringing a normal zoom lens – something like a 24-70mm kit zoom (full-frame) or it's cropped-sensor equivalent. Ground is likely to be muddy so you might also like to bring along a garden kneeling mat to take those low angle shots.

Finances:-

We have £953 in the bank. We will need £244 for web costs for the year.

Bollington Beer Festival Grant 2024. Terry is going to try for a grant of £300 this year. This is the submission in support of our application (supplied by Simon.)

"As a direct result of the much appreciated grant funding last year, we have finally had the resources to roll out phase 1 of our new website as intended. The new site has enabled our better integration with social media and the Bollington Photographic Facebook group.

Our increased public visibility has resulted in membership nearly doubling, and the new website gives us the ability to interact with, and invite the involvement of, non-members from the wider community to join in our photographic contests, further promoting Bollington Photographic group.

The website has meant that we have been able to easily advertise our educational talks and photographic walks. These are suitable for all abilities and ages, are held throughout the year, and are also bookable on-line, something which would have been almost impossible without funding the current website.

As we are a small group, the grant has assisted us in being able to keep our subscriptions to a moderate level, benefitting all concerned in these difficult times. More importantly, with our new members bringing their undoubted enthusiasm and skills to our group, we have already been able to start giving back to our community by providing new publicity images to the Town Council and Bollington Live Magazine."

We hope to be able to continue this journey into the next year and beyond.

Our future aim is to provide a digital platform for Bollington residents to lodge their photographic memories of the next festival as an archival community resource. This will take a considerable amount of time and inevitably, money.

A professionally built web portal with cloud hosting is well beyond our reach, costing many thousands of pounds, but we can, with assistance, start small and give something back as we go. By incrementally building on our site in a controlled way, we can minimise the expenditure but gain the knowledge and expertise to enable us to have this resource in place prior to the next festival.

An additional grant this year will assist us in our goal to develop this resource for the community."

Finances continued:-

Should we offer to pay towards the lighting that will be needed when the photos are relocated? The Turners committee say they will pay but it might be worth asking them.

Janet asked "if we had plenty of money in group funds what we would do with?" It was discussed. It could be used to fund transport to venues we would like to visit. However, Terry with his treasurers hat on said that minibus hire can be very expensive."

Turners Photo Wall

Submission of entries is underway now. Simon expressed concerns that there are not many entries yet. Gill asked how many entries were submitted to previous exhibitions. I am trying to remember how many there were for the theme of "Close Up". Janet thinks it was 47 and that was a record. When Simon looked back at the numbers it might not be as bad as feared.

On our What's App group Gill posted that there was to be an Artists Trail planned in Bollington for Saturday 4th and Sunday 5th May this year. The publicity states that "Artists and Photographers ... showcase your work in your own home or studio space! Tickets (with map showing all your locations) will be printed and on sale at many central places in Bollington from mid-April onwards. Please contact Claire Moreland.

Janet contacted Claire and managed to get our exhibition onto the Trail at the very last minute. The Turners now know about this.

Website

The barrage of daily adjustments the Simon has to deal with is beginning to settle down now.

The fact that we cannot Google our <u>bpg22.org</u> site yet was explained by Simon. It is a way to protect us from unwanted attacks. We decided that we should open ourselves up to google briefly to assess what might happen.

Simon also mentioned that cloud based storage is not an option yet because of the cost.

"Just a stone's throw from the centre of Leeds, St Aidan's is a stunning place to explore. Whether you're on foot, on your bike, riding a horse or have your camera at the ready, take advantage of the amazing views and wonderful wildlife including Bitterns, Black-necked Grebes, Little Owls, Kestrels, Black-headed Gulls and Lapwings.

St Aidan's has been transformed from an old, open cast mine to a reserve that's alive with wildlife. Its relatively small size means you can easily explore a rich variety of habitats including reedbeds, wetlands, meadows and woodland."




Kevin Welton asked on the What's App group what happens to the images when they come off the wall. John confirmed that he gives them back to any of the members who want them and that he saves them the others.



- We probably don't need posters. We might try this for now. But some flyers will be needed in places where they are easy to pick up. (Places like Heathcote and Barrows Butchers, the Leisure Centre, the Post Office, the Library, Macclesfield Tourist Information Centre, the Vets etc.)
- All the information about walks and talks coming up for the rest of the year are sorted now. Details are in

Finances

The accounts are up to date and are as follows:

- Current bank balance is £1548.88 of which £150 is retained, from the Beer Festival Grant, for development of the new website.
- This leaves a net total of £1398.88 of which some of these monies will be required to pay for a qualified person to undertake the final fix of the spotlights to the existing power supply. Simon has already secured the spotlights and the invoices have been paid for materials associated with the project.
- I've submitted our grant application to Bollington Town Council for £130 stating that the monies will be used for the cost and installation of the spot lights for the Turners Wall exhibitions.

Membership

Simon explained that we now have 4 membership levels, not 3. They are as follows:-

Full membership is 'access all areas' - continuous until you cancel. One payment per year.

Subscription membership is continuous (as full membership above) but in 3month payments.

Annual membership is as full membership above, but only for a single 12 months period.

Free Browsing is a 30 day trial only.

All types of membership are accessible (and can be adjusted or cancelled) from the membership pages.

The system should give all members notice of renewal before the end of the term.
